We were delighted to welcome back Almir Pessoa and Pepe Barcellos, two of the Brazilian musicians that we formed a strong bond with through the Brazilian Music and Culture programme that we were involved with last Summer. This project has forged a cultural link between London and Rio in celebration of the Olympics.

In the last few weeks, the music of Brazil has been captivating our students and the wider community with its infectious rhythm and beautiful melodies bathed in harmonic warmth. As well as teaching our talented young musicians, Pepe and Almir performed alongside them at 606 Club and Chelsea Theatre and took Brazilian music into seven local schools for a Young Children's Music Festival.

Thanks to the Jack Petchey Organisation, World Heart Beat students were able to take part in a Video Blogging training workshop where they learned about shooting, lighting, editing and sound, as well as how to tell a compelling story and present on-camera.

At the end of the workshop, all World Heart Beat students who submitted a video were selected to go and spend a day at the YouTube studios to learn more about video blogging.

Out of over 1,000 participants, Quinn Oulton and Elsa Hackett from World Heart Beat were selected as two of only fifteen finalists to have their videos screened at BAFTA.

This programme is supporting many young musicians towards fulfilling careers in the music industry through a structured, dynamic programme taught by the best Jazz musicians in the country and featuring performance opportunities in inconic venues in London and Europe.

We are truly thankful to Julian Joseph, Mark Mondesir and Mark Hodgson who gave up their precious time to headline this event.

Learning to play Jazz music enables young people who would not otherwise be able to access a musical education to find their voice, and the self-confidence to express themselves through the music, giving them more than just a new skill but also a whole new outlook on life.
